Covers all the aeronautical knowledge required to pass the FAA knowledge exams and operate as a Private Pilot, with an additional ten percent, clearly identified, to raise readers to the Commercial Pilot standard.

The Pilot’s Manual: Instrument Flying (PM-3B) teaches pilots how to fly IFR with techniques used by experienced and professional pilots, taking advantage of the building-block technique. Readers will master the groundwork required for instrument flight before going through the knowledge and skill required for departure, en route, terminal and approach procedures. All of the tasks from the FAA’s Practical Test Standards are covered in this text, giving instrument students a solid foundation to obtain and use the instrument rating. *Instrument Flying* contains up-to-date procedures and tips that could only be gleaned from experts, making it an invaluable reference book for the instrument-rated pilot as well.
