Page 2, question 1, in answer, change item d. to read:

d. Hold at least a current Second Class Medical Certificate to exercise the privileges of a Commercial Certificate (a pilot may complete the practical test with either a Third Class Medical or complying with BasicMed).

Page 2, question 2, in answer, change items c. and e. to read:

- c. 20 hours of training on the areas of training listed in §61.127(b)(1) that includes at least 10 hours of instrument training. This must include:
 - One 2-hour dual cross-country flight in a single-engine airplane in daytime conditions that consists of a total straight-line distance of more than 100 nautical miles from the original point of departure; and
 - One 2-hour dual cross-country flight in a single-engine airplane in nighttime conditions that consists of a total straight-line distance of more than 100 nautical miles from the original point of departure.
 - Five of the 10 hours of instrument training must be in a single-engine airplane.
- e. 10 hours of solo flight time in a single-engine airplane or 10 hours of flight time performing the duties of PIC in a single-engine airplane with an authorized instructor on board that include:
 - One cross-country flight of not less than 300 nautical miles total distance, with landings at a minimum of three points, one of which is a straight-line distance of at least 250 nautical miles from the original departure point.
 - 5 hours in night VFR conditions with 10 takeoffs and 10 landings at an airport with an operating control tower.
